Entry Requirements

- Enter individually on 4HOnline beginning March 15, 2022 at <https://texas.4honline.com>
- Contest Fee – \$25 per contestant
- Late Entry Fee - \$50 per contestant

District Deadlines

- Registration on 4HOnline by **April 14, 2022**
- Late entry – **April 15-19, 2022** (late fees apply)

Entry Divisions (grade by August 31, 2021)

- Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5
- Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8
- Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12

Adult Participation

- District 5 adults (parents, volunteers, and agents) with a registered 4-H youth member are invited to participate in this match.

- Register on 4HOnline by credit card. Payment via check or money order (no cards) the day of the match will also be accepted. Note that cash **CANNOT** be received.
- Same entrance requirements as 4-H youth (see above).
- Show off your archery skills for District 5 “bragging rights!”

Tentative Schedule

- Check-in beginning at 8:00 a.m.
- Safety orientation will begin at 8:45 a.m.
- Events will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.

Special Accommodations

- Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the District office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering on 4HOnline.

Lunch

- A hamburger, chips and drink lunch will be provided each registered participant. Additional lunch baskets may be purchased at time of registration on 4-HOnline for \$5.00 per ticket.

Golf Carts/Buggies

- You are welcome to bring a golf cart or buggy to travel from station to station. Motorized vehicles will need to stay on the road and remain out of the designated target ranges.
- Targets are stationed within walking distance of each other. Boots that can get wet or muddy are recommended.

Warm-up/Practice Field

- Warm-up before the match on the practice range behind the main building between 7:45 and 9:15 a.m. Adult supervision is required.
- During tabulation of the scores, registered participants may use the targets to practice their archery skills. Adult supervision is required.

District 5 3-D Archery Contestant Rules

Archery (individual entry)

Entry

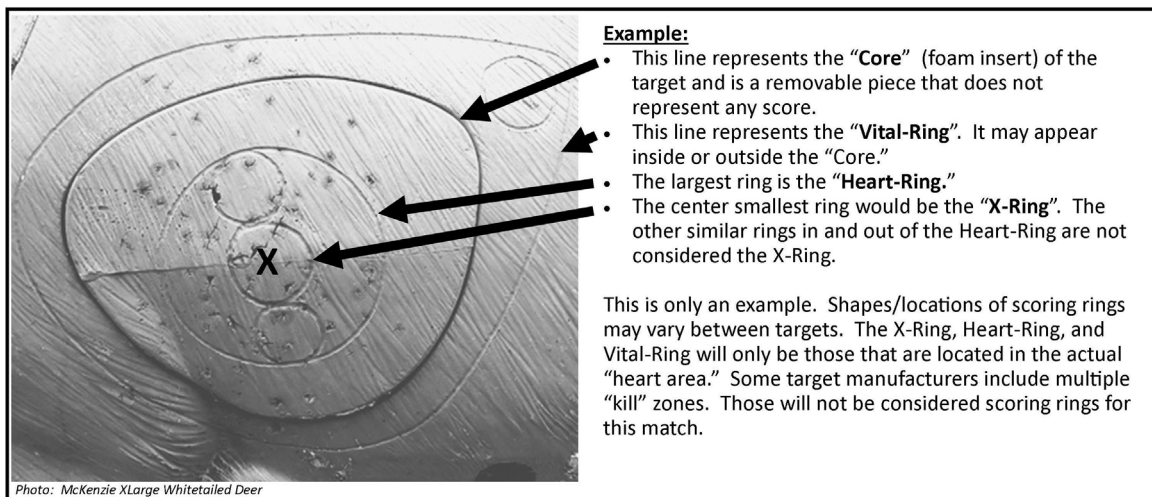
- Enter as an individual youth or adult on 4-H Online.

Equipment

- Each competitor must provide their own bow and arrows.
- Class Options:
 - Barebow
 - Recurve
 - Compound Aided
 - NASP Genesis[®] Barebow
- 3-D targets of deer, wolf, turkey, rabbit, alligator, and more will be provided.

Archery Rules

1. Texas 4-H Archery Rules will be followed except as noted in these contest rules. Texas 4-H Archery rules will be used to structure this event.
2. All entries must be submitted through 4HOnline by individual 4-H members within the Registration Period. There will be no on-site registration.
3. Participants will be randomly assigned to a group of 5 or less people of varying age divisions. Registered adult participants will shoot with the same group in which their child is assigned.
4. Targets will consist of up to thirty (30) 3-D targets of varied species and size.
5. Youth archers will take three recorded shots at each 3-D station. It will be a staggered start. Adult archers will take one recorded shot at each 3-D station.
6. Distances to each target will vary based on age division, however, they will be an “unknown” distance. Each target station will have four color-coded stakes (blue, red, white, and orange) to serve as shooting points for each age division (blue, red, and white for youth and orange for adults).
7. Scoring will be based on the Texas 4-H 3-D Scoring System that will be used at the state 4-H archery match.



8. Bow classes will include Barebow, Recurve, Compound Aided, and NASP Genesis[®] Barebow. Texas 4-H Archery Rules define and govern each division. A brief description is provided below:
 - a. Barebow - no wheels, sights, stabilizers, or releases are permitted. It must be longbow or recurve design only.
 - b. Recurve - no magnified sights, no wheels, or releases are permitted. It must be longbow or recurve design only.
 - c. Compound Aided - use of sights, releases, stabilizers are permitted. Design must include an axel and wheel (cam).
 - d. NASP Genesis[®] Barebow—must be stock Genesis[®] bow (bare). Arrows must be unmodified Genesis 30” arrows.

Awards

- An award ceremony will take place after lunch in the main building.
- Individual awards for 1st – 3rd places in each age division will be presented. Youth archers placing 1st in each age division will receive a rosette and a prize to be determined by committee.
- Overall individual high point award will be presented youth in each age division and adult participant.
